

Investigator: Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (MFCU) – Hauppauge

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for Investigator positions located in various locations in the State. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

MFCU is the centerpiece of New York's effort to investigate, penalize, and prosecute individuals and companies responsible for improper or fraudulent Medicaid billing schemes. In addition, the MFCU is the only law enforcement agency in the state specifically mandated to investigate and prosecute abuse and neglect of residents in nursing homes, hospitals, and other facilities that provide care to unrelated adults.

The qualifications for this specific position include: expertise in interviewing and interrogation skills; extensive experience in the investigation of confidential and sensitive matters; advanced computer skills, experience investigating corruption matters; experience conducting surveillance operations; experience in obtaining and executing search warrants; experience in interaction and coordination with other law enforcement agencies; having established law enforcement contacts in the New York City and surrounding areas. Proficiency in a second language is favorable.
