

Supervising Investigator: Investigations - New York City

Investigators, under supervision, conduct detailed investigations of the circumstances, facts and conditions connected with complaints and violations of the law, using the highest level of independent judgement and discretion. These are often highly complex and sensitive criminal matters which cross county lines and involve organized crime.

The qualifications for this position are: Supervision experience, holding the rank of Detective Sergeant or the equivalent; extensive experience conducting stationary and moving surveillance; experience conducting covert investigations; experience conducting internal investigations; proficient in investigative databases, dignitary protection and financial investigations; and, having established contacts within the law enforcement community in the New York City area.

Must have at least ten years of law enforcement and current NYS basic police school certification.
