

Investigator: Investigations – New York City

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) is seeking qualified candidates for Investigator positions located in various locations in the State. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

Investigators, under supervision, conduct detailed investigations of the circumstances, facts and conditions connected with complaints and violations of the law, using the highest level of independent judgment and discretion. These are often highly complex and sensitive criminal matters which cross county lines and involve organized crime.

The qualifications for this position are: Experience planning and conducting surveillance; experience interviewing witnesses; ability to translate and transcribe conversations in Spanish; experience investigating a variety of frauds, including money laundering, forged and counterfeit checks, and identity theft; experience investigating internal affairs; established contacts within the law enforcement community in the New York City area. Knowledge of American Sign Language is a plus.

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

Must have at least ten years of law enforcement and current NYS basic police school certification.
