

Investigator: Organized Crime Task Force (OCTF) - Albany

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for Investigator positions. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

Investigators, under supervision, conduct detailed investigations of the circumstances, facts and conditions connected with complaints and violations of the law, using the highest level of independent judgment and discretion. These are often highly complex and sensitive criminal matters which cross county lines and involve organized crime.

The role of the OCTF is to conduct complex, long term investigations into various types of organized criminal activity. The majority of the Unit's investigations utilize advanced and specialized investigative techniques such as physical surveillance, court authorized eavesdropping of telephones, businesses, vehicles, and computers, as well as search warrants, which include the use of still and video photography. The nature of the investigations conducted by OCTF includes traditional organized crime - gambling, loan sharking, extortion, and narcotics, among others.

The qualifications for this position are: Experience investigating organized criminal enterprises; e.g., prostitution, gambling, and narcotics trafficking; expertise in money laundering and financial investigations; experience utilizing electronic eavesdropping equipment; experience conducting surveillance, both stationary and mobile; experience as an affiant on search warrants and electronic eavesdropping warrants; experience utilizing SYTECH; experience in voice recognition and analysis; expertise in interviewing and interrogation; and law enforcement contacts in the area served by the Albany office of the OCTF.

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

Must have at least ten years of law enforcement experience and current NYS basic police school certification.

All candidates must reside in New York State at the time of appointment.
