MFCU, the centerpiece of New York's efforts to combat Medicaid provider fraud, is looking for experienced investigators to conduct complex investigations into fraud committed by Medicaid providers and others in the healthcare industry who steal from New York State, those involved in the diversion of prescription narcotics, and to investigate and prosecute abuse and neglect of residents in nursing homes, hospitals, and other residential healthcare facilities.

The qualifications for this position are: possession of a Bachelor's degree; experience investigating gambling, prostitution, and narcotics; extensive experience conducting felony investigations including homicides, experience with wiretaps, search warrants and the planning and conducting of surveillance; having established contacts within the law enforcement community serving the Syracuse area.

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

Must have at least ten years of law enforcement and current NYS basic police school certification.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends.
