

Investigator: Investigations - New York City

Investigators, under supervision, conduct detailed investigations of the circumstances, facts and conditions connected with complaints and violations of the law, using the highest level of independent judgment and discretion. These are of ten highly complex and sensitive criminal matters which cross county lines and involve organized crime.

This position performs investigations in a wide variety of cases in various bureaus throughout the Office of the Attorney General in the New York City region. **The qualifications for this specific position include: Experience holding the title of Detective 2nd Grade or higher; experience in robbery, narcotics, organized crime and homicide investigations; experience providing dignitary protection; experience doing surveillances, both hands on and video; Spanish speaking ability; facility interacting with other law enforcement agencies; and law enforcement contacts in the New York City area.**

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

Must have at least ten years of law enforcement and current NYS basic police school certification.

Must have the ability to drive a vehicle and possess a valid NYS driver's license.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends.
